GAME TIMES

15-Pure | 12:15pm - 1:45pm | [3] 15 minute periods (no ice cut between periods)

16U | 2:00pm - 3:30pm | [3] 15 minute periods (no ice cut between periods)

18U | 3:45 - 5:15pm | [3] 15 minute periods (ice cut between 2nd and 3rd period)

CHECKING

Full body checking will be in effect for all games.

OFFICIATING

All Star Games will be officiated using a four man system as approved by USA Hockey.

OVERTIME

In all division games that end in a tie after regulation time ends, the teams shall play a four (4) on four (4) Sudden-Death Five (5) Minute Overtime Period. Please note the following:

- Overtime occurs with time permitting in the ice slot, this is determined by the event staff.
- Teams do not change ends.
- No ice cut.
- Timeout permitted during overtime period providing it was not used in regulation time.
- If a team receives a penalty in Overtime, the teams will play 4 on 3. If the same team is assessed a second penalty before the first one expires, then the penalties will “stack”.
- If the Sudden Death Overtime period does not produce a winner there will be a three man shoot out.

THREE PLAYER SHOOTOUT

- Goaltender's/player's that are not eligible to participate in the shoot out are those who have received a Game Misconduct or Match Penalty during the game. Any player(s) still serving a penalty at the end of the overtime period, shall be considered ineligible for the shoot out.
- The home team chooses which team will shoot first.
- The goaltender from each team may be changed after each shot.
- There is no required order for the skaters of either team.
- The team with the fewest rostered skaters shall determine the number of skaters that must participate before a skater can participate in the shoot out again.
- If the shoot out remains tied at the end of the first round (three players) then the shoot out will go to sudden death with each team having an equal number of opportunities to shoot before a winner is declared.
- The shoot out will end when it is mathematically impossible for one team to at least remain tied by continuing the shoot out.
